

Command and Control (C2). In a globalized context, command has to do with commanding respect and allegiances. Control involves controlling good will and outcomes. CCP's model is incapable of this.

1. In general terms, CCP commands capacities and controls outcomes globally and at home based on deception and coercion. This is an artificial construct dependent on fear and lies.
2. CCP's hold on authoritarian power is based on the use of corruption and coercion to keep the most essential Chinese power elites under control.
3. CCP operates effectively by creating a Climate of Fear at home which takes elaborate organization and extensive funding.
4. CCP generally uses corruption, fear and coercion as its principle modus operandi for command and control.
5. CCP's advantage is based on coercive control of a finite set of corrupted decision makers and key persons in foreign public and private sectors. This is a thin veneer of talent and power which is highly targetable.
6. This is also true of CCP's coercive control of power elites in neighboring countries such as Vietnam.
7. CCP's command and control model works only as long as everyone complies with CCP's will.
8. CCP's recent use of Wolf Diplomacy's to bully nation state and business leaders demonstrates inflexibility to operate outside of its coercive norms.
9. CCP's command and control apparatus is dysfunctional in the sense that it (1) is not self-sustaining, (2) takes extraordinary management of fear, deception and human controls, (3) is excessively expensive to run, and (4) does not generate authentic allegiances.
