

Fears. CCP leadership is hobbled by a combination of fears, which reinforce its tendency to rely more heavily on deception, coercion and oppression. This traps CCP leadership in paranoia-based rationalization in all competitive and combative matters. This rationalization strengthens top-down authoritarian control of all matters, which, despite CCP's strengths, greatly limits its options.

1. CCP leaders first fear global backlash that will significantly degrade essential cash flow for CCP strategy implementation.
2. CCP leaders then fear they will not be able to maintain essential control over corrupted foreign leaders and key persons in public and private sectors.
3. Decades of costly multi-level propaganda and marketing are getting exposed as fraud. Overseas print media propaganda is on the ropes. They have informationally painted themselves into a corner. Loss of return on investment. Loss of advantage.
4. CCP leaders next fear that popular backlash against China across the global community will overmatch the coercive control that CCP has enjoyed over foreign decision makers and key persons.
5. CCP leaders generally fear facts.
6. CCP leaders fear expanding exposure of facts about CCP's strategy of dominance.
7. CCP leaders fear the exposure of specific facts, which will break the CCP's dominance strategy / game.
8. CCP leaders fear unity among US allies diplomatically, economically and militarily.
9. CCP leaders fear they have ruined China's chances for a sustained rise to global dominance.
10. CCP leaders fear being blamed for losing or spoiling China's accumulated advantage over many decades.
11. CCP leaders fear they cannot control their peoples' awareness of CCP failings and lies.
12. The Chinese people and CP leaders fear massive unemployment.
13. China fears systemic food shortages that it cannot resolve.
14. CCP leaders fear expanding popular discontent on Mainland China based on lack of reforms.
15. CCP leaders fear their people are now much more aware of CCP's failings at home and abroad.
16. Hong Kong is a catalyst for resistance and revolution.
17. CCP cannot handle protests and resistance other than by violent methods, which further alienate the people.
18. CCP leaders fear expanding exposure of CCP abuses from all levels within Chinese society.
19. They fear increasing isolation by systemic violations of The Rome Statute.
20. The fear increasing information and intelligence "Push" to USA by Chinese sources.
21. CCP leaders fear the rise pro-West Chinese constituencies on Mainland China.

22. CCP leaders fear the emboldening of pro-West revolutionaries and reformists on China's periphery in S and SE Asia.
23. CCP leaders fear they will lose their hold on power.
24. CCP leaders fear loss of income from global trade.
25. CCP leaders know their military lacks combat experience.
26. CCP leaders know they cannot protect / secure their overseas holdings.
27. CCP leaders fear nationalization / freezing of overseas assets.
28. CCP leaders fear retaliatory economic measures by the global community.
29. CCP leaders fear loss of favored nation trading status and advantages.
30. CCP leaders fear foreign boycotts exporting vital goods to China.
31. CCP leaders fear foreign boycotts importing goods from China.
32. CCP leaders fear their elaborate deception and disinformation apparatus is now impotent in the face of a more savvy and angry global community.
33. CCP leaders fear the loss of deceptive capacity will unravel their economic strategy.
34. CCP leaders fear China's peoples' exposure to foreign thinking and influences.
35. China fears foreign exploitation and "re-colonialization".
36. CCP leaders do not want war or internal conflict because these are too costly to bear.
37. CCP leaders fear US military power and lethal war.
38. More importantly, they fear US ability to organize and lead military coalitions.
